# DATES TO REMEMBER

## A MESSAGE FROM OUR PRINCIPAL

Dear PHS Parents and Families:

We are gearing up for exams. Students have been working hard to finish up the semester with final tests, projects, and presentations. School is closed on Monday for the Martin Luther King, Jr. Holiday. Tuesday is our last day of regular class. Exams begin on Wednesday.

Today, I reviewed the exam schedule again. Especially for the 9<sup>th</sup> graders, I wanted to clearly communicate how each day will work. I reminded the students that during exams, there can be <u>no</u> <u>early releases</u> until exams are finished each day (12:20 PM) so that we do not disrupt testing for any student. I asked them to remind you to check your schedule and make sure there are no doctor appointments or other events planned that would take students out of school prior to 12:20 PM on these days. If so, we kindly ask that you rearrange those appointments or plan for your child to take the make-up exam on January 24 (the make-up exam day).

We also ask that parents monitor their child during exam week and encourage a regular bedtime, a breakfast with protein to last for several hours, and plenty of water for hydration. We know that these are keys to students feeling their best so they can do their best on their exams.

Tuesday is also the last day to do Attendance Recovery for this semester. If students have a valid excuse for their first semester 4x4 absences and if they were unable to complete their required Attendance Recovery, they must complete an Attendance Recovery Appeal Form. Appeal forms are

available in the guidance office and in the main office at school. The deadline for Appeal Forms to be submitted is **Tuesday**, **January 17**.

In other news, this week, CMS released the **High School Graduation Schedule**. Our seniors in the Class of 2023 will graduate on **Wednesday**, **June 14** at **12:30 PM** at Bojangles' Coliseum. All are invited to the ceremony. Tickets are not required. We hope you will plan to attend.

## Scholarship of the Week: People Helping People Scholarship

The State Employee Credit Union (SECU) Foundation established the People Helping People fouryear scholarship program to help North Carolina public high school students attend college. Although the SECU Foundation Scholarship program recognizes academic achievement, the People Helping People Scholarship recognizes leadership, integrity, and community involvement. This \$10,000 scholarship is available only to graduating public high school seniors who are either current members of SECU or the child of a parent/guardian who is a member of SECU at the time of application. Membership eligibility does not include Local Government Federal Credit Union or NC Press Association Credit Union members. Preference will be given to students whose parents or guardians and family members are public sector employees (state, local or federal government; public health; public education) who live and work in North Carolina. Additionally, preference will be given to those majoring in public service degree programs (such as public health, education, public administration, and public policy). Students must attend one of the North Carolina public universities.

Additional details and the application process are in Naviance. The application is due February 24.
