A MESSAGE FROM OUR PRINCIPAL

Dear PHS Parents and Families:

Happy New Year. I hope you and your family had a wonderful break from school (and work). Providence is back in session, and it looks like we have not missed a beat. Students have quickly gotten back to work. I'm so proud of them. We have one more week of regular school, and then we move into the exam schedule.

As a reminder, mid-term exams for A/B day classes and final exams for 4x4 classes will be given **January 18-24**. Here is the exam schedule for students. A copy has been posted on our #OneProv Canvas page for access by all students.

During exams, there can be <u>no early releases</u> until exams are finished each day (12:20 PM) so that we do not disrupt testing for any student. Please check your schedule and make sure there are no doctor appointments or other events planned that would take students out of school prior to 12:20 PM on these days. If so, we kindly ask that you rearrange those appointments or plan for your child to take the make-up exam on **January 24** (the make-up exam day).

As we prepare for exams, we have reminded the students that this is an excellent time to bring up any grade that may not be where they want it to be. Mid-term exams count as 20% of the 1st

semester grade. Final exams count as 20% of the course grade. Twenty percent is enough of a percentage to make a difference. We want all of our students to study and put their best foot forward. Here are some <u>study tips</u> that might help. Please share these with your child. We encourage them to get rest before each exam so they will be fresh and on top of their game.

Also, please be reminded that if your child has more than 10 absences (excused or unexcused) in any 4x4 course for 1st semester, they must do Attendance Recovery so they are able to receive the academic grade they earned. The last day for students in 1st semester 4x4 classes to do Attendance Recovery for this semester is **January 17**.

In other news, please see the announcements below:

<u>Pre-ACT Scores:</u> On Monday, 10th graders will receive their test booklet and their Pre-ACT scores. Please ask that they bring them home to you. On **Tuesday, January 31**, we are hosting 10th grade Parent Night, which will feature information on the ACT/SAT, how to interpret the scores, and how to help prepare your child for one of the two college entrance exams accepted by colleges and universities.

<u>Credit by Demonstrated Mastery:</u> There is a State Board Policy that provides an option for students to demonstrate mastery and receive credit for a course by taking an assessment and then completing an artifact reflecting content mastery. Credit by Demonstrated Mastery (CDM) is only available for standard-level courses. CDM credits are awarded as a pass/fail grade and therefore do not impact grade point averages. Students requesting CDM for Math courses must have completed (or be currently enrolled) in the previous course of the math course sequence (i.e., if a student requests CDM for Math 3, the student must have taken or be currently taking Math 2).

If a student chooses to participate in CDM for a course and successfully meets the assessment score and demonstrates mastery on the completed artifacts, credit will be provided for the upcoming semester. Students who wish to participate in CDM must have a completed application turned in no later than January 20. The Student Application and FAQs here: SpringCDM2023. New - Scholarship of the Week: People Helping People Scholarship

The State Employee Credit Union (SECU) Foundation established the People Helping People four-year scholarship program to help North Carolina public high school students attend college. Although the SECU Foundation Scholarship program recognizes academic achievement, the People Helping People Scholarship recognizes leadership, integrity, and community involvement. This \$10,000 scholarship is available only to graduating public high school seniors who are either current members of SECU or the child of a parent/guardian who is a member of SECU at the time of application. Membership eligibility does not include Local Government Federal Credit Union or NC Press Association Credit Union members. Preference will be given to students whose parents or guardians and family members are public sector employees (state, local or federal government; public health; public education) who live and work in North Carolina. Additionally, preference will be given to those majoring in public service degree programs (such as public health, education, public administration, and public policy). Students must attend one of the North Carolina public universities.

Additional details and the application process are in Naviance. The application is due **February 24**.
