A MESSAGE FROM OUR PRINCIPAL

Dear PHS parents and families,

This has been a smooth week at school. Students in 4x4 classes are finishing up their fourth block exams today. There are teacher workdays on **Monday, November 6**, and **Tuesday, November 7**. Students should have an opportunity to rest and enjoy some time with their friends and family. When students return to school on **Wednesday, November 8**, it will be the first day of second quarter. **Friday, November 10**, is a holiday in honor of Veteran's Day. We want to give a special "thank you" to the veterans who served our country and now serve our school community: CDR O'Hora, 1st Sgt. Worthy, and Mr. Cawthon.

Even though we are halfway through with the first semester, it is important for students in 4x4 classes to understand that only 40% of their 4x4 course grade has been earned. There is still ample opportunity for them to improve their grade (should that be necessary). The second quarter grade will count as 40% and the final exam in January will count as 20%. One of the things we need to encourage our students to do is study and/or go to tutoring. Tutoring might not have been something that students participated in while in middle school, but in high school, tutoring is a common occurrence. In fact, some of our brightest or most conscientious students frequently go to tutoring. Listed at this [link](#) is the tutoring schedule for each teacher. Each of these tutoring times is located on the course prospectus for the teacher/course. But, to make it easier to find, I wanted parents to have this one document in case you need it for reference.

We have some upcoming Parent Workshops to make you aware of:

- On **November 15**, we will host Junior Night at **6:30 PM** in the PHS Auditorium. This workshop is for 11th grade students and their parents. At Junior Night, we will discuss the college preparation process, the college search process, and things to work on during junior year that will set students up to be ready for the college application process next year.
- On **November 28**, we will host Financial Aid Night at **6:30 PM** in the PHS Media Center. This workshop is for parents of seniors. We will focus on how to pay for college. This is not just about financial aid but is also about how to find and apply for scholarships. I learn something each time I attend. Our guest speaker is from the College Foundation of NC.
- On **December 6**, we will host a NCAA Clearinghouse Workshop at **6:30 PM** in the Auditorium. This workshop is for any student and their parent who wish to learn more about playing sports in college. We will teach the criteria for being eligible to play sports at the college level, discuss the Clearinghouse website, help you find resources, and discuss the transfer portal.

After the December 6 event, our School Counseling Team will have hosted five parent workshops this fall to help our parents, students, and families have the most up-to-date information and resources as they navigate high school and make plans for what comes after high school.

Tonight, our Varsity football team will travel to Weddington for the first round of NCHSAA playoffs. Members of our cross-country team will compete in the state championship meet in Kernersville tomorrow. Good luck to our student athletes.

Player Registration

This year CMS has changed its process for athlete registration. The Dragonfly site will be used to collect all documents, including physicals, proof of residency, and other required documents. This site will also be where the required CMS athletic participation fee will be collected. All this information must be completed prior to first games, but many coaches may require this information to be completed shortly after tryouts. The registration site is dragonflyathletics.com. Please start this process now so there is no delay in students' participation in PHS sports.

Providence Athletic Fee

The Providence athletic fee, which is paid by student athletes, is the primary fundraiser for Providence Athletics and supports all PHS sports. Athletes are asked to contribute \$80 if they play one season and \$130 if they play two or three seasons, and all have the option to contribute more. The Providence athletic fee can be paid through <https://www.pay4schoolstuff.com>.

PAC Membership via Hometown Fan App

Purchase your PAC membership and get admission to all home athletic games. Membership is valid for the entire school year: all sports, any season, multiple membership options. It does not include club sports and home playoff games.

The funds raised go directly to Providence Athletics to support field and facility maintenance, athletic equipment purchases, equipment maintenance, scholarships, continuing education for coaches, student athlete recognition, transportation to games, and senior recognition.

To purchase your membership, please follow these steps:

1. Download the Hometown Fan app at <https://www.hometownticketing.com/resources/hometown-fan-app/> and search for Providence Athletic Club, or go to <https://charlottemeck.hometownticketing.com/embed/all?schools=203>.
2. The app will generate a QR code for every home sporting event as your admission to the game.
3. Family memberships: each family member will use the same QR code to access all events. This will allow four, five, or six QR code scans for each event.
4. There is a \$3 convenience fee added to the cost of each membership.
