A MESSAGE FROM OUR PRINCIPAL

Dear PHS parents and families,

We have had a busy week at school this week. We have just 4 weeks before final exams and we are all working hard to make sure our students are prepared. I've been encouraging our students to persevere. Fourth quarter is a hard time of the school year. No one wants to be in school or do homework when the weather is so nice outside (not even me). But we are on the right track and we need to finish strong. I'm reminded that "It's not how you start, but how you finish that counts." Let's work together to finish strong!

At this time every year, the pace of school and the number of events and activities seem to kick into overdrive. Please see the following bits of information to help you keep up:

All students have been reminded of their **Attendance Recovery** obligations. The last day to do Attendance Recovery is **May 30**. Please review your child's absences per course. If they have absences above 10 in any course, they automatically receive a failing grade (F) in the course unless they do Attendance Recovery to make up any time over 10 absences. Students can do Attendance Recovery every morning before school at **6:15 AM** in room 403. They can also do Attendance Recovery every afternoon (except Fridays) in SMC (the Student Management Center) from **2:15 – 3:00 PM**. Lastly, any time they spend with their teacher in tutoring after school, making up a test or

quiz after school, etc. can count towards Attendance Recovery. Ms. Reda, our Attendance Secretary, is the expert in Attendance Recovery so if you have any questions, please contact her in the main office.

Students who cannot fully complete all of their Attendance Recovery time, can do as much time as is available and submit an Attendance Recovery Appeal Form. Forms will be available at the end of May. In order for an appeal to be granted, students will need to have doctor's notes or other documentation to explain why they have a large number of absences and / or why they were unable to complete the Attendance Recovery.

Next week, we plan to share with you the specific **Final Exam** schedule. Please plan for **June 3 – 6** as the final exam days. (The English 2 Final Exam will be on May 31). If students have doctor appointments or other off-campus obligations during this time, we ask that you please reschedule them. Students will not be able to leave campus before 12:30 PM each day during exams (unless they have Early Release in their schedule). If they are unable to reschedule an appointment, we will have a make-up exam day on June 7 and the student can take the exam then.

Our AP students will start their **AP exams** on Monday. We have 894 students taking 1718 AP exams covering 32 subjects using 100 classrooms. This is a big project stretched out over 2 weeks, while at the same time we keep regular school moving ahead. Most of our AP Exams will be given at CPCC Levine campus. We have communicated this with each class of AP students and encouraged them to drive to Levine this weekend to make sure they know how to get there. They do not need the added anxiety on the day of their exam of trying to locate a new place. Please help your child with this. Also, attendance for AP students who are taking exams may experience a delay in appearing in PowerSchool, especially for students who are in afternoon exams. We must report the attendance to Providence which may be late in the afternoon, after our Attendance Secretary leaves for the day. You should wait 24 hours before contacting us that your child was counted absent from school but was in an AP exam.

Good luck to our spring sports teams as they head into playoff season. Our student athletes are working so hard on and off the field, court, or green and we are excited to see them go very far in playoff season. Go Panthers!

Player Registration

This site will also be where the required CMS athletic participation fee will be collected. All this information must be completed prior to first games, but many coaches may require this information to be

Providence Athletic Fee

The Providence athletic fee, which is paid by student athletes, is the primary fundraiser for Providence Athletics and supports all PHS sports.
