Dear PHS Parents and Families:

The first semester of this school year has gone very smoothly. We are only a few short weeks away from mid-term or final exams. I'm so proud of the progress our students continue to make. They are working hard and I'm sure you would be very proud to see what I can see as I visit the classrooms each day. Our teachers are pouring into the students so they can achieve above their peers when compared to other students across NC and our country.

At school, we are continuing to focus on teaching college and career-ready skills that students need to have before they graduate. We are embedding these learning experiences into every class. We have had visits or received emails from our recent graduates who are now in college, and are always eager to hear what skills they learned in Providence which they found most helpful in their studies. The top skills include responsibility and organization, but also research and writing skills which have helped them understand and discern what they see and hear. Providence alumni have told us that the skills learned and the very process of developing the Junior Paper (even though these words themselves might strike anxiety in most 11th graders) has been most helpful in college. One former student recently told us that she had written several research papers similar to what was expected in the Junior Paper during her first semester in college. In addition to college preparation, an area of focus this semester has been on career-readiness and job market opportunities. Our new Career Development Coordinator, Ms. Hall, has been a huge asset in helping students learn about careers, exploring trades as a career, connecting students with resources at the community college level, and much more.



This semester, we have received several accolades from the North Carolina Department of Public Instruction which I shared in the Mews, our weekly newsletter. They are listed below:

- Providence is again the HIGHEST performing High School in CMS with a School Performance score of 92, a School Growth Score of 100, and a grade of A (the highest grade that can be earned).
- In fact, Providence has the HIGHEST growth of any High School in North Carolina and the 2nd highest in North Carolina overall.
- Providence students again EXCEEDED expected growth which means that students grew
 more than predicted (based on their individual state test scores from previous years). We
 are most proud of this achievement. "Growth" is an indicator that the state uses to
 determine the difference between the performance a student should make in a course as
 compared to their actual performance in a course.
- ALL of our subgroups (White, Asian, Black, Hispanic, Economically Disadvantaged, Multilingual Learners, and Students with Disabilities) MET or EXCEEDED expected growth.
 All subgroups exceeded expected growth except Students with Disabilities. The Students with Disabilities subgroup met expected growth.
- Our graduation cohort rate is above 95%. This means when students enter 9th grade, they
 graduate on time in four years with the peer group with which they entered high school.
 Our students' ACT score is the HIGHEST in CMS (even compared to the Middle and Early
 College High Schools). It is the HIGHEST of any comprehensive High School in NC.
- Providence has the highest percent of Advanced Placement exam (AP) test takers passing the AP exam of any high school in CMS.

We are so proud of our students, and their teachers. We know that there is always room for growth with our students and within our school. We will continue to work hard so the results continue to be noteworthy and the students reap the benefits of a strong, comprehensive high school education.

In addition to the strong academic education our students receive at Providence, I want to highlight something else that makes our school special. The athletic, fine arts, and extra-curricular opportunities in which our students are involved create a full, comprehensive environment for students to develop leadership, teamwork, and other skills. This edition of the PawPrints is full of recent honors, awards, and activities featuring our students. I hope you enjoy reading all about them.

Thank you for sharing your children with us and thank you for helping us make this first semester a huge success. Go Panthers!


EMILY BOHAN




RYAN DUDNEY

QUIZ BOWL

The Providence Quiz Bowl team recently took first place out of 16 teams at the Aiken Fall Steeplechase Tournament in Aiken, SC. The victory qualified Providence to compete in the National Championship Tournament to be held in Atlanta this coming May. Members of the winning "A" team were Isha Sharma, Henry Chen, Ian Brown, and Ankit Biswas. Individually, Connor Gozycki, Ian Brown, and Vijay Sudhakat Vetriselvi all placed in the top ten out of over 70 participants. The Quiz Bowl club has seen a surge in interest this fall and is building upon momentum from last year, when Providence won the NCASA Regional Championship and placed third at the state competition.

Over the summer, current Quiz Bowl President Ian Brown and last year's president, Jacob Koch (now at Georgia Tech), competed on "Team Computer Scientists" in a nationally televised trivia game show called the "Spectrum News Challenge." WOMEN'S LACROSSE




PASSIONATE VOLUNTEER— GIANLUCCA SIMON LEYVA BLANZACO
